Get a peek into my thoughts when writing *What Lies We Keep* in Linden Stewart's <u>Author Confessions</u> column. I had a great time answering her questions.








Cybersecurity Tip

As you give this holiday season , remember that amidst the joy of giving are cybercriminals working to enact fraud. Here are a few tips for charity donations:

Smart Steps 4 You

Don't follow unsolicited web links or attachments in email messages. They may lead you to a fake website that mimics an established charity.

Never make cash donations.

<u>Do a little research.</u>

Legitimate charities will gladly send you written information when requested. There are non-profit watchdog groups that evaluate a charitable organization's performance in a number of areas, such as:

- <u>Charity Watch</u>
- IRS Tax Exempt
 Organization Search
- <u>Charity Navigator</u>
- Better Business Bureau
- <u>California Registry of</u>
 <u>Charitable Trusts</u>

Always make your checks payable to the organization, not to the individual soliciting.

Call organizations directly.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be a representative of a particular agency, hang up, look for the organization's number, then call—confirm the person contacting you is legitimate.
